In every Olympic Games, there are compelling human interest stories. For those of you who are old enough to remember names like Dan Jansen and Derek Redmond bring to mind heart-tugging stories. But allow me to introduce you to one of my heroes from the 2012 London Games. His name is Hamadou Djibo Issaka.

Hamadou is from the West African country of Niger. Six months ago, he was working as a gardener. Just three months ago, he took up the sport of "sculling" (rowing). In his heat, he finished 1:39 seconds behind the winning sculler. To put that in perspective, that means he finished three and a half football fields behind the winner! As a result, he's been dubbed the "Sculling Sloth".

Obviously, he wasn't in the same class as his competitors. In fact, he told a reporter after the race that he was just glad that he didn't make his boat fall over. Although he was totally exhausted, he was determined to finish the race and he did. He said the cheers of the spectators kept him going.

Friends, doesn't that remind you of life? For some, life comes so easy and they can row with grace and speed through still waters. But for others, life seems to come hard and requires rowing against the wind through troubled waters. No matter how life comes to you, don't guit! Finish the race, and when you do, you won't be judged by your speed, but by your perseverance.

"A City that Is Set on a Hill Cannot Be Hid"

In Matthew 5:14-16, Jesus said that we are lights of the world that cannot be hid. Let us notice some observations from this text.

First, Jesus is the ultimate source of light. John would record this about Jesus in John 1:4: 3:19-21. Darkness stands for sin, ignorance and evil. On the other hand, light represents righteousness, knowledge and good. Even Jesus Himself claimed, "I am the light of the world..." (John 8:12; cf. 12:44-46).

Second, the Bible is our light. The psalmist stated, "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path" (Psalm 119:105: cf. 19:7-8) We come to receive our faith in God, experience the new birth, inherit (Continued)

spiritual immortality and enjoy light in the gospel all by the word of God, which Peter explained in I Pet. 1:22-23.

Third, a true disciple contains the light and shines it brightly in the darkness. Paul was light to the Gentiles (Acts 13:47), and the inspired wise man stated that we do the same (Proverbs 4:18-19). Just as our text affirms, we are lights of the world, walking "as children of light...and have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them" (Ephesians 5:8-11). Just as a light that does not work is useless, a Christian whose light does not shine is useless to God.

Finally, our lights will not work if we do not remain connected to the source of power. Electricity or alternate sources of power are necessary for light to function. Is your light working? Do you have a relationship with Jesus that urges you to live for Him daily and shine your light everywhere you go (cf. Galatians 2:20)? When Saul of Tarsus saw "the light," he was baptized (Acts 22:12-16). To make the world a better place, we need to be in Christ, free from sin and shining gloriously! —-Sam Wilcutt
